- 6. Both were good servants. Genesis 39:1-6
- 7. Both faced temptation which they overcame. Genesis 39:7-18
- 8. Both were falsely accused. Genesis 39:17 and 18
- 9. Both were incarcerated between two prisoners, one which lived and one which died. Genesis 40
- 10. Both gave God the glory for their ability. Genesis 41:16
- 11. Both were exalted to great status. Genesis 41:39 and 40
- 12. Both began to serve at age 30 Genesis 41:46
- 13. Both became the source of bread for a hungry world. Genesis 41:53-57
- 14. Both became preservers of life. Genesis 45:5
- 15. Both freely and fully forgave those who had betrayed them. Genesis 50:20
