1 month between Exodus and Numbers (Leviticus) Numbers takes 40 years

Moses: 1st 40 years in Pharaoh's House

2nd 40 years in Midian running from Pharaoh

3rd 40 years in the desert wilderness with people of Israel

1 st Census	1: 2, 45-46 3:39	603,550 males over 20 years old and able to go to war Plus 22,000 male Levites over 1 month old

2nd Census 26:51 601,730 males over 20 years old and able to go to war 26:62 Plus 23,000 male Levites over 1 month old

26:64-65 "But among these there was not a man of those who were numbered by Moses and Aaron the priest when they numbered the children of Israel in the Wilderness of Sinai. 65 For the Lord had said of them, 'They shall surely die in the wilderness', So there was not left a man of them, except Caleb, the son of Jephunneh, and Joshua, the son of Nun."
