Proverbs is about Wisdom. Ecclesiastes is about Foolishness. Song of Solomon is about Love.

Ecclesiastes is from the Latin form of the Greek word for preacher or philosopher.

The Greek word ekklesia in the New Testament means "called out" referring to the assembly, the church.

Solomon is the author. 1:1, 12 and 2:9

1 Kings 3:12 There was not anyone wiser before Solomon and not anyone wiser after Solomon.

1 Kings 11:11-13 11 Therefore the Lord said to Solomon, "Because you have done this, and have not kept My covenant and My statutes, which I have commanded you, I will surely tear the kingdom away from you and give it to your servant. 12 Nevertheless I will not do it in your days, for the sake of your father David; I will tear it out of the hand of your son. 13 However I will not tear away the whole kingdom; I will give one tribe to your son for the sake of My servant David, and for the sake of Jerusalem which I have chosen." NKJV

Solomon had it all – and lost it all. We are all just one decision away from stupid!

The Jewish writer Sholom Aleichem once described life as "a blister on top of a tumor, and a boil on top of that." Poet Carl Sandburg compared life to "an onion — you peel it off one layer at a time, and sometimes you weep."

Ecclesiastes is a favorite book of atheists and, quoted and misquoted by atheists.

It's about the emptiness of everything apart from God.

Man has tried many things to be happy without God. Not just foolish pride.

The key word is vanity, which occurs 37 times.

The key phrase is "under the sun", which occurs 29 times. and, "I said in my heart."

5.	Ch 4:7-8	Vanity of greed	Get more and remain empty.
6.	Ch 4:16	Vanity of fame	One day popular, then forgotten. "15 minutes of fame"
7.	Ch 5:10	Vanity of wealth	Money does not satisfy.
8.	Ch 6:9	Vanity of coveting	Wanting breeds more wanting.
