"God remembers" "whom Jehovah remembers" 28 people in Old Testament named Zechariah

Date: 520 BC One of three Post-Exilic prophets. A contemporary of the prophet Haggai Quoted about 40 times in the New Testament Zechariah was a priest and a prophet. Neh 12:4 of the family of Aaron The prophets Ezekiel and Daniel were prophets in Babylon during the exile. The historical books of Ezra, Nehemiah & Esther are Post-Babylonian exile Of the 1 million Jews in exile in Babylon, only around 50,000 returned. 2 out of 15 people returning from Babylon were priests. Rebuilding the temple Messianic – 1<sup>st</sup> coming, 2<sup>nd</sup> coming and Millennial Reign

1:3 "Return to Me, and I will return to you" The "Lord of Hosts" is Zechariah's name for Jehovah God 2:11"the Lord" the Pre-incarnate Christ

We should follow that example when defying the devil. Don't speak directly. Jude 9-10 Yet Michael the archangel, in contending with the devil, when he disputed about the body of Moses, dared not bring against him a reviling accusation, but said, "The Lord rebuke you!"

James 4:7 Submit yourselves to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

Garments: Symbolic of removing the iniquity of Israel and showing the future glory.

# 4:1-14 The Lampstand and Olive Trees

- :6 Not by might nor power, but by My Spirit Not by military strength or political power
- :10 The eyes of the Lord, Which scan to and fro throughout the whole earth.
- :12-14 Perpetual oil for the anointed priest and king, who stands with the Lord. Zerubbabel, Joshua

# 5:1-4 The Flying Scroll

The scroll, the Word of God, goes forth to judge. To consume the thief and liar

- 5:5-11 **The Woman in a Basket** An Ephah- the largest measure in use among Jews. Symbol of Wickedness locked in a basket and carried away to Shinar- Babel, Babylon, the city of sin, the first place of rebellion against God.
- 6:1-8 **The Four Chariots** Judgements of the Lord among the nations.

#### 6:9-15 **The Command to Crown Joshua**

- 6:10 Receive the gifts of the captives in Babylon, take the silver and gold and make a crown for the head of Joshua
  - 6:13 Ch 4 Zerubbabel and Chapter 6 Joshua Crown put on Joshua the priest. Prophet, Priest and King come back together MESSIANIC PROPHESY
